Arrival of King Jaume I and his entourage

> Saturday, 5th September

> Route: Via Roma, Torre Vella, Via Aurèlia, Via Roma, Barcelona street, Espigó del Moll (breakwater), Llevant Beach



The crown's troops are mobilising. The King has given the order. Salou will now become the site where King Jaume I will gather his troops to depart to Majorca. From everywhere in the kingdom, people are setting off for the coast of Salou to stand by their monarch: Nobility, farmers, knights, clergymen, soldiers... and, of course, with King Jaume leading them, accompanied by his wife Violant of Hungary and his entourage of guards, chroniclers and authorities.

The King's troops and entourage are expected to arrive around 7 pm. They will proceed along the ancient Roman route, Via Roma, to join the royal company. When the sun starts to set -around 8 pm- the entire retinue, led by the King, will start to deploy from the Old Tower. The entourage will march down Barcelona Street to Llevant Beach, which is the designated rendezvous point for setting sail to Majorca. The entire kingdom is anxiously awaiting this day. History is waiting for them.
